

THE WORD

FIRST LESSON Exodus 20:1-17

20 Then God spoke all these words:

² I am the LORD your God, who brought you out from the land of Egypt, where you were slaves.

³ You shall have no other gods beside me. ⁴ You shall not make any carved image for yourself or a likeness of anything in heaven above, or on the earth below, or in the waters under the earth. ⁵ Do not bow down to them or be subservient to them, for I the LORD your God am a jealous God. I follow up on the guilt of the fathers with their children, their grandchildren, and their great-grandchildren, if they also hate me. ⁶ But I show mercy to thousands who love me and keep my commandments.

⁷ You shall not misuse the name of the LORD your God, for the LORD will not permit anyone who misuses his name to escape unpunished.

⁸ Remember the Sabbath day by setting it apart as holy. ⁹ Six days you are to serve and do all your regular work, ¹⁰ but the seventh day shall be a sabbath rest to the LORD your God. Do not do any regular work, neither you, nor your sons or daughters, nor your male or female servants, nor your cattle, nor the alien who is residing inside your gates, ¹¹ for in six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth, the sea, and everything that is in them, but he rested on the seventh day. In this way the LORD blessed the seventh day and made it holy.

¹² Honor your father and your mother so that you may spend many days on the land that the LORD your God is giving to you.

¹³ You shall not commit murder.

¹⁴ You shall not commit adultery.

SECOND LESSON 1 Corinthians 1:22-25

²² Yes, Jews ask for signs, Greeks desire wisdom, ²³ but we preach Christ crucified—which is offensive to Jews and foolishness to Greeks, ²⁴ but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ is the power of God and the wisdom of God. ²⁵ We preach Christ crucified, because the foolishness of God is wiser than men, and the weakness of God is stronger than men.



SERMON John 2:13-22

The Zealous Savior

STAND

¹³ The Jewish Passover was near, so Jesus went up to Jerusalem.

¹⁴ In the temple courts he found people selling cattle, sheep, and doves, and money changers sitting at tables. ¹⁵ He made a whip of cords and drove everyone out of the temple courts, along with the sheep and oxen. He scattered the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables. ¹⁶ To those selling doves he said, "Get these things out of here! Stop turning my Father's house into a place of business!"

¹⁷ His disciples remembered that it was written, "Zeal for your house will consume me."

¹⁸ So the Jews responded, "What sign are you going to show us to prove you can do these things?"

¹⁹ Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up again."

²⁰ The Jews said, "It took forty-six years to build this temple! And you are going to raise it in three days?" ²¹ But Jesus was speaking about the temple of his body. ²² When Jesus was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this. Then they believed the Scripture and what Jesus had said.

who proceeds from the Father and the Son,


who in unity with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

C: Hear our prayer.

M: O God, whose steadfast love in Christ is good, turn in your abundant mercy to all who suffer in our midst, that the flood may not sweep over them nor the pit close its mouth on them. Deliver them from sinking into the mire and deep waters, and grant them healing, comfort and peace. Lord, in your mercy,

C: Hear our prayer.

M: O Lord, you bless this day and make it holy with your Word and the gifts of your altar. Grant us to come before you in humble repentance to eat your Son's body and blood, that we may not boast in ourselves in your presence but in Christ alone. Lord, in your mercy,

C: Hear our prayer.

M: O Lord, our Rock and Redeemer, as three days after the temple of your Son's body was destroyed by wicked men he raised it up again, grant that on the Last Day we and all the saints who now rest in your presence may share in the glory of his resurrection. Lord, in your mercy,

C: Hear our prayer.

M: All these things and whatever else you know that we need, grant us, Father, for the sake of him who died and rose again and now lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God forever.

C: Amen.

C: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. 


WORDS OF INSTITUTION

DISTRIBUTION

In accordance with the Scriptural practice of closed Communion, we invite to the Sacrament of Christ's body and blood the communicant members of this congregation. We invite also the communicant members of our sister congregations in our fellowship (the WELS and the ELS) who have made their intention known to one of our pastors. We ask other guests in attendance to refrain from taking the Sacrament with us today, and we invite you to speak with a pastor about how you may join our fellowship and commune with us in the future.

To limit the proximity of our members and reduce the possibility of transmitting disease, we are asking our communicants to approach the chancel steps by families. If your family is seated closer to the center aisle, you may come to the table closer to the Baptismal font. If your family is seated closer to a side aisle, you may come to the table farther from the font. Please wait until the family ahead of you has communed and returned to their seats before approaching.






