

THANKSGIVING DIALOGUE

selected verses from Psalm 65

M: Praise awaits you, O God, in Zion; to you our vows will be fulfilled.

C: O you who hear our prayer, to you all men will come.

(sung) Praise to God, immortal praise, For the love that crowns our days.

Bounteous Source of ev'ry joy, Let your praise our tongues employ.

All to you, our God, we owe, Source whence all our blessings flow.

M: Those living far away fear your wonders;

C: Where morning dawns and evening fades, you call forth songs of joy.

M: You care for the land and water it; you enrich it abundantly.

C: The streams of God are filled with water to provide the people with grain, for so you have ordained it.

M: You drench its furrows and level its ridges; you soften it with showers and bless its crops.

C: You crown the year with your bounty, and your carts overflow with abundance.

M: The grasslands of the desert overflow; the hills are clothed with gladness.

C: The meadows are covered with flocks and the valleys are mantled with grain; they shout for joy and sing.

(sung) All the plenty summer pours, Autumn's rich o'erflowing stores, Flocks that whiten all the plain, Yellow sheaves of ripened grain – Lord, for these our souls shall raise, Grateful vows and solemn praise. (CW 612:2)

M: Because our God of grace uses his mighty power to rescue us, we humbly approach his throne, penitent for our sins and begging for his full and free forgiveness.

C: Lord of life, I confess that I am by nature dead in sin. For faithless worrying and selfish pride, for sins of habit and sins of choice, for the evil I have done and the good I have failed to do, you should cast me away from your presence forever. O Lord, I am sorry for my sins. Forgive me, for Jesus' sake.

M: Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good. His love endures forever. In his great mercy, God made us alive in Christ even when we were dead in our sins. Hear the word of Christ through his called servant: I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

(sung) Peace, prosperity, and health, Private bliss and public wealth, Knowledge with its gladd'ning streams, True religion's holier beams – Lord, for these our souls shall raise, Grateful vows and solemn praise. (CW 612:3)

M: When we were overwhelmed by sins, you forgave our transgressions.

C: Blessed are those you choose and bring near to live in your courts.

M: We are filled with the good things of your house.

C: We are filled with the blessings of your holy temple.

M: You answer us, God our Savior, and you save us with awesome deeds of righteousness.

C: You are the hope of all the ends of the earth.

M: You set the mountains in place by your strength, showing your mighty power.

C: You calm the roar of the sea; you calm the peoples' uproar.

THE WORD

FIRST LESSON Deuteronomy 8:1-10

Be conscientious about carrying out the entire body of commands that I am giving you today so that you may thrive and increase and you may go in and possess the land that the LORD promised by oath to give to your fathers. ² Remember the whole journey on which the LORD your God led you these forty years in the wilderness, in order to humble you and to test you, in order to know what was in your heart, whether or not you would keep his commandments. ³ So he humbled you and allowed you to be hungry. Then he fed you manna, which neither you nor your fathers had known before, in order to teach you that man does not live by bread alone, but man lives by every word that comes from the mouth of the LORD. ⁴ The clothes you wore did not wear out, and your feet did not swell these forty years. ⁵ So know in your heart that just as a man disciplines his son, so the LORD your God disciplines you. ⁶ Therefore you are to keep the commandments of the LORD your God by walking in his ways and by revering him. ⁷ For the LORD your God is bringing you into a good land, a land of gullies filled with water, a land with springs and groundwater that flows out into the valleys and down the mountains, ⁸ a land with wheat and barley and vines and fig trees and pomegranates, a land of olive trees for oil, and honey, ⁹ a land where you can eat bread and not be poor, where you will not lack anything, a land whose rocks are iron and from whose mountains you can mine copper. ¹⁰ Then you will eat, and you will be filled, and you will praise the LORD your God for the good land that he has given you.

SECOND LESSON 1Timothy 2:1-4

First of all, then, I urge that petitions, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, ² for kings and all those who are in authority, in order that we might live a quiet and peaceful life in all godliness and dignity. ³ This is good and pleasing in the sight of God our Savior, ⁴ who wants all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth.

M: Alleluia, alleluia. Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good. His love endures forever. Alleluia.

GOSPEL Luke 17:11-19

¹¹ On another occasion, as Jesus was on his way to Jerusalem, he was passing along the border between Samaria and Galilee. ¹² When he entered a certain village, ten men with leprosy met him. Standing at a distance, ¹³ they called out loudly, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!"

¹⁴ When he saw them, he said, "Go, show yourselves to the priests." As they went away they were cleansed.

¹⁵ One of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, glorifying God with a loud voice. ¹⁶ He fell on his face at Jesus' feet, thanking him. And he was a Samaritan. ¹⁷ Jesus responded, "Were not ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? ¹⁸ Was no one found to return and give glory to God except this foreigner?" ¹⁹ Then he said to him, "Get up and go your way. Your faith has saved you."

Many of you are aware of the efforts to begin a new WELS mission in Dane County. At its meeting this past week, the church council voted to designate \$1300 from our Mission Fund to go towards the funding of this new effort. It was also decided to gather special gifts/offerings for the remainder of this year from any who would like to support the new mission. Christian Aid and Relief grant totals for fiscal year 22-23:

\$1,641,154

DISASTER RELIEF: \$502,944 was utilized for disaster relief. Most recently we have provided disaster relief for those impacted by Hurricanes Ida and Ian, and the war in Ukraine.

HUMANITARIAN AID: \$708,958 helped to provide basic needs for people all over the world. Home missions receiving humanitarian aid grants include congregations in Canada, Colorado, New Mexico, Florida, and Texas. World mission fields in Africa, Asia, and Europe also received assistance.

PERSONAL GRANTS: \$429,252 was used to fund personal grants given through our congregations to assist people going through a health or financial crisis.
