THE ORDER OF HOLY BAPTISM (10:30 a.m.)

REMAIN SEATED

M: The grace of our Lord (+) Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you.

C: And also with you.

CONFESSION OF SINS

- M: Our Savior Jesus Christ commanded baptism when he said: "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." All of us are born into this world with a deep need for baptism. From our parents we inherit a sinful nature; we are without true fear of God and true faith in God and are condemned to eternal death. But Jesus took away our sin by giving his life on the cross. At our baptism he clothes us with the robe of his righteousness and gives us a new life. Our sinful nature need not control us any longer. We recall what baptism means for our daily lives as we speak these words:
- C: Baptism means that the sinful nature in us should be drowned by daily sorrow and repentance, and that all its evil deeds and desires be put to death. It also means that a new person should daily arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.
- **M:** As baptized children of God we confess our sins:

The congregation may kneel.

C: Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful, and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words, and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.

M: God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son (+) and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

The Rite of Baptism continues at the font.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

M: Jake, by the power of the Word, the Holy Spirit has led you to believe that this new life in Christ is yours. Now in Holy Baptism the Lord Jesus assures you of your salvation. That you may give public testimony of your faith, I therefore ask you: Do you believe that you were born in sin and therefore eternally lost?

A: Yes, I believe.

M: Do you believe in the Triune God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit?

A: Yes, I believe.

M: Do you believe that this Triune God planned and carried out your salvation?

A: Yes, I believe.

M: Do you believe that God grants you the forgiveness of sins in Holy Baptism?

A: Yes, I believe.

M: Do you desire to be baptized?

A: Yes, I do.

M: Receive the sign of the cross on the head and heart (+) to mark you as a redeemed child of Christ.

The minister applies water to the person presented for baptism as he says:

_____, I baptize you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

The Almighty God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—has forgiven all your sins. By your baptism, you are born again and made a dear child of your Father in heaven. May God strengthen you to live in your baptismal grace all the days of your life. Peace be with you.

STAND

EXHORTATION

M: Brothers and sisters in Christ:

Our Lord commands that we teach his precious truths to all who are baptized. Christian love therefore urges all of us, especially parents and sponsors, to assist in whatever manner possible so that Jacob may remain a child of God until death. If you are willing to carry out this responsibility, then answer: Yes, as God gives me strength.

C: Yes, as God gives me strength.

M: Let us pray:

Merciful Father in heaven, we thank you for the blessing of baptism by which you offer and grant the forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation. Help us to regard our baptism as the robe of righteousness we are to wear all the days of our life. Look with special favor on Jacob and grant him a rich measure of your Spirit that he may grow in faith and godly living. Make us willing to carry out our responsibilities to those who have been baptized, so that all of us may finally come to the blessed joys of heaven, through Jesus our Lord.

C: Amen.

THE WORD

M: The Lord be with you.

C: And also with you.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

M: Let us pray.

We praise you, O God, for the great acts of love by which you have redeemed us through your Son, Jesus Christ. As he was acclaimed by those who scattered their garments and branches of palms in his path, so may we always hail him as our King and follow him with perfect confidence; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.



Community Easter Egg Hunt – This Saturday March 30 at 10:00 am:

We are planning our annual Community Easter Egg Hunt. This activity is a great time to invite family, neighbors, and friends at school to join us. Children of all ages are invited to participate. You do not need to sign up ahead of time and there is no cost. The morning starts with a devotion with Pr. Jenswold and then heads outside to collect eggs. Fun activities are inside after the egg hunt. Volunteers are needed to help that morning - set up, assist with activities, and clean up after the event. Ideally, we could use 10 more volunteers. To help, sign up at church or contact the church office. Volunteers arrive at 8:30 am and usually leave at 11:30.

Church is collecting donations of candy to fill our eggs. As of Friday (3/22), we have 1,500 pieces of candy. We usually fill around 3,000 eggs so could use more. Candy must be wrapped and should not contain peanuts or peanut butter. It should be small to fit in our plastic eggs. Donations can be placed in the bin at the back of church.



Easter Flower Donations: The altar guild is asking for donations of potted flowers to decorate our sanctuary for Easter Worship. Suggested flowers include Easter lilies, tulips, daffodils, hyacinth, and other spring blooms. Donations can be brought to church anytime from now till Good Friday March 29. The altar guild will arrange them for Easter. Donated flowers can be taken home after the Easter services. If you would like to donate towards the purchase flowers, the altar guild can purchase

them for you. Please place your donation in the envelope in the church office by today, March 24. Checks should be made out to Lord of Love Lutheran.

Patchwork Blankets: There has been a great response to starting the patchwork blankets sewing group. These blankets will be made here at church and donated to area charities. The group will begin meeting on Monday April 15. There will be two possible times to participate. Each Monday from 12 - 3 pm and every other Monday evening from 6:00 - 8:00pm. Participants can come as often as they like and do not need to attend each gathering. The group is asking for donated materials that will be used to create the blankets:



- Fabric that is 100% cotton will be used for the squares of the blankets. Donated material needs to be 9" x 11" or larger.
- Material that will be used for the filler in the blankets such as sheets, flannel sheets etc.
- Yarn: Any color
